PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This program will focus on strategies to address prescription opioid misuse and abuse in three targeted healthcare lines (rural healthcare providers, Obstetrics and Gynecology providers, and adolescent health providers). A healthcare provider from each of these disciplines will provide education, treatment options, and a best practice algorithm for patients who have been affected by the opioid epidemic. This program will be open to all persons who provide care for patients in any of these 3 populations.

Opioid use, misuse, and abuse is an epidemic in our country. Opiate use in the United States has risen dramatically in recent years. In 2012, prescribers wrote 82.5 opioid prescriptions and 37.6 benzodiazepine prescriptions per 100 persons. Healthcare providers need increased education using evidence based guidelines to improve opioid use in pain management. Physicians should ask all patients receiving opioid therapy about current, past, and family history of addiction.

At the conclusion of the program, healthcare providers will be equipped to provide current healthcare management to their patients who use and/or misuse opioids.

OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this continuing medical education program participants will be able to:

1. Prescribe opioids more judiciously to vulnerable patients
2. Decrease the correlation between early opioid exposure and misuse/abuse of opioids in adulthood
3. Decrease the incidents of NAS (Neonatal abstinence syndrome) among newborns born to mothers with history of opioid use during pregnancy
